How we spend our money is a reflection of our values. Oregonians have made it clear time and again that we're stronger together. Oregon taxpayers don't believe that their money should fund family separations and the federal government's radical immigration enforcement agenda.

Problem

Private companies like Avelo Airlines have contracted with the federal government to operate deportation transportation, devastating families and communities. These actions are inhumane and go against Oregon values. Businesses helping this agenda should not receive state funding in the form of public contracts.

Right now, a company can receive public subsidies or contracts while simultaneously engaging in immigration enforcement activities that contradict Oregon law and values.

✓ Solution: HB 4150

The bill will require companies seeking public contracts to self-attest that they will not conduct business with the federal government for the purposes of immigration enforcement. This bill does not regulate the federal government, it regulates how Oregon spends Oregon money.

If a company wants state contracts or tax benefits, it must comply with Oregon law, including our longstanding protections for immigrants and refugees. Public dollars should reflect the public interest. Oregonians are the customer and we get to choose how we spend our money.

Keep Oregon taxpayer money out of the hands of federal immigration enforcement.

Pass HB 4150.
